Cease-fire, pullout call by UN Assembly

In the continued heavy fighting against the Indian aggressors, our Army, Navy and Air Force continued to inflict heavy punishment on the enemy in all sectors.
Yesterday, Pakistani troops made further advances in the Indian-held Kashmir and blunted all Indian bids to regain their lost territory in the Punjab plains. Our Army also remained in control of the situation in East Pakistan.

Continuing its hunt and kill mission, the Pakistan Air Force yesterday bombed more air bases in the enemy territory and downed three more Indian planes, thus bringing the total of IAF planes destroyed so far to 108. The Air Force also gave close support to our ground forces and destroyed 40 enemy tanks during the past two days bringing the total number of tanks knocked out to seventytwo.

The Pakistan Navy, in dramatic encounters off the coast of Karachi, attacked and heavily damaged a Russian-built submarine of the Indian Navy, yesterday.

Telling blows by PAF in air, on ground

RAWALPINDI, Dec 8: Besides serving telling blows on the Indian Air Force, thus bringing about a favourable air situation for us, the Pakistan Air Force is giving effective support to the Pakistan Army and destroyed 40 Indian tanks in various sectors along the West Pakistan border during the last two days.

The PAF is continuing to kill raiding enemy planes. Today they shot down two SU-7 which had come to attack Islamabad air base in the afternoon. Both aircraft were intercepted and shot down by PAF fighters. One IAF Hunter was shot down near Sulaimanki air base, Wing Commander Cooles was captured. Yet another SU-7 was hit by ground fire in this sector but it could not be confirmed whether it was "killed".

With its successive losses, the total number of Indian aircraft destroyed so far including those shot down by ground fire and by the Pakistan Navy, goes up to 108. The number of Indian planes in our hands now has risen to 11.

Simultaneously, our ground forces support to the Army and killing enemy aircraft on raiding missions, the PAF continued attacking Indian air bases. For the fourth successive night yesterday our bombers bombed IAF air bases including Jodhpur, Dibrugarh, Patcoke, Amritsar and Bhat. The attack continued till early hours of the morning and all our aircraft returned safely to their bases.

Defence fund set up: Yahya's plea

RAWALPINDI, Dec 8: President Gen. A. Y. Khan today urged the Government to set up a defence fund to channel the offers of help that were pouring in from all national defence efforts.

The President appealed to all the people to contribute generously to the fund. He said: "It is a great war which requires no front. All of you are in the front. Every man, woman and child must contribute by working hard, by continuing to save and produce more."

The following is the text of the President's appeal for donation to the National Defence Fund: "To the brave soldiers in our military when we are engaged in repelling the aggression of a ruthless enemy, each one of you has a part to play. While our brave Army forces are giving their lives for the defence of the entire nation, it is your duty to contribute to the defence effort."

INDIA SUFFERS SEVERE DEFEAT

LONDON, Dec 8: Pakistan Army's dramatic breakthrough in the Chitral sector of occupied Kashmir was described by British correspondent Michael Burman as a "severe defeat" for India.

The British correspondent reports from New Delhi that the "gateway to Kashmir" had been thrown open to Pakistan Army following advances admitted by Indian Defence Minister Jaisingh Ram.

He said that any Indian "victory" in the Punjab and West Punjab would be a "severe defeat" for India.

A change in attitude in the Punjab, he said, would mean the end of the Indian Army in Kashmir and the "new strong bargaining position" for the future of the subcontinent.

WANTON IAF STRAFINGS More civilians killed

LAHORE, Dec 8: Seventeen civilians were killed and 50 were injured in a wanton attack by Indian Air Force on civilian population at various places in the Punjab region, officials here today said.

The Indian planes dropped a one thousand pound bomb at Panjra, killing 17 people and injuring 50. Another 35 were killed and 50 injured when a 500 pound bomb was dropped at the Indian village of Jhok. UNITED NATIONS, Dec 8: The UN General Assembly voted overwhelmingly last night to call upon India and Pakistan to observe an immediate cease-fire and withdraw their armed forces to their own territories.

The resolution was approved by 14 votes to 41, with 10 countries—including Britain and France—abstaining. India and Pakistan also abstained.

The resolution also demanded that both sides bring about immediate cessation of the voluntary cease-fire and their homes of the East Pakistan refugees in India.
