- 2. No person shall attend or therwise take part in any secting, demonstration or a meeting, procession organised or conven-ed or taken out in contraven-tion of paragraph 1 of this Regulation.

Explanation: For the purpose of this Reg p'ace" includes. Regulation 'public

- (a) Any educational institu-tion, mill, factory workshop, hospital, clab and any other place to which public has ac-cess whether on payment or
- (b) Any tent, enclosure or other structure of temporary nature erected or constructed for the purpose of demonstration or a meeting; and
- (c) Any enclosure or com-pound whether forming part of a building or not which is not covered by a roof.
- 3, Martial Law Regulation Nos. 60 and 61, issued by the Chief Martial Law Administrator, are hereby cancelled.

- (e) Tends directly or indirect-'v. or is calcu'ated to create or excite feelings of chmity, ill-. Ill or hatred between communifies, sects classes or sec tions of the citizens of Pak-
- (f) Tends directly or indirectly to be offensive to the religion of Is'am: or
- (g) Tends directly to be disrespectful to the Quaid i-
- 2. No person shall print, or publish, or cause to be printed, or published in a newspaper

(a) Tends directly or indirectly to create hatred or ill-will towards any political party in Pakistan or any leader or mem-ber thereof; or

(b) Tends directly or in. directly, or is likely to cause acitation, excitement, a'arm or descendency amongst the pub-Ic on any political issue without first submitting such matter for scrutiny to an authority appointed in this behalf by a Provincial Government and obtaining clearance from the said authority.
