Chittagong cleared of anti-state elements

According to official sources, Chittagong, the biggest port in East Pakistan, has been cleared of anti-state elements and peace-loving citizens are helping the local Martial Law authorities in bringing back complete normalcy, says an APP report.

A number of political leaders including Mr. Fazlul Qader Choudhry, Maulvi Farid Ahmad and Mr. Sultanuddin Ahmed have met local Martial Law authorities and assured them of their cooperation in restoring normal activities.

A number of shops and markets for vegetables, mutton, fish and poultry are open and people in large numbers are doing their shopping, especially for essential commodities. Foodstuffs are available in plenty in the ration shops.

Work has been resumed in the port also.

In the residential areas many people who had earlier left their houses are now coming back.
