General Hamid was also told that some antistate elements, supported by Indian troops with covering fire from across the border last week managed to sneak into a few places alone the easter, border They sought to disrup our means of communications but they were detected in time and eliminated. 

## Unprovoked firing by Indians protested

ISLAMABAD, June 23:—Pakstem has protested to India
against the repetitions of improvoked firing on and trespassing into Pakistan's territory by the Indian Border
Security Force (BSF) and
other armed personnel, it was
officially stated today, reports
APP.

Two notes handed over to the Indian High Commissioner here separately on June 21 and

June 22 protested against India's continuing hostility and said Pakistan reserved right to claim compensation for the loss caused to life and property in these incidents.

Another APP message from Rawalpindi says: The fresh incidents have been reported of unprovoked Indian firing into East Pakistan on June 21 it was officially stated today.

The first incident occurred

in the Baikari area of Khulna district, when the Indians fired at Pakistani troops. In dians also fired with heavy mortar and field guns on Pak-istan border outpost at Bena-pole in Jessore district.

A Pakistan patrol party on normal border patrolling was fired upon by Indian troops in Bogra district using heavy and light machine-guns.
