Smear campaign against Pakistan in Britain

ISLAMABAD. July 5:—Pakis an has a rongly proceed to Britain against unceasing attacks on his country by the British Parliamen. B. B. C. and other information media, official sources said today, reports APP.

The British High Commissioner, Mr. John Laurence Pumphrey is understood to have been called to the Foreign Office on July 3 and handed over a note in which the Governmen of Pakistan expressed its deep concern over the smear compagn against Pakistan in Britain.

The more it is learnt, invi-

tes the attention of the British Government to the activities of responsible British citizens and others hrough the socalled Bangla Desh Action Committee, with the publicly stated aim of des roving the uni y and integrity of Pakistan. Funds are being raised in Great Britain for he purpose of acquiring arms and ammunition for use in East Pakistan. The protest note also refers to the statement of British Foreign Secretary Sir Alec Douglas Home on June 23 which amounts to encroachment upon Pakistan's internal affairs.

concern and protes over these developments, the Government of Pakistan is unders ood to have expressed the hope hat remedial measures would be taken by the British Government o rect fy the si uation before further harm is done to the relations between the two coun ries.

Mr. Pumphrey was also called to the Foreign Office on June 28 and apprised of Pakistan Governments serious concern over Sir Alec's statement in he Howe of Commons.
