

Gen. Niazi visits Saidpur

Support to Armed Forces in repelling Indian aggression

SAIDPUR, Nov. 30.—At a huge public meeting presided by Lt. General A. A. K. Niazi, Commander, Eastern Command and Martial Law Administrator, Zone 'B' today, the people of Saidpur pledged their full support to the Armed Forces in repelling Indian aggression, reports APP.

They also expressed their determination not to let the Indian's desecrate their soil as long as a single Pakistani was alive. The public meeting which was held at the vast ground near the Saidpur airfield also paid glowing tributes to the Armed Forces for making the supreme sacrifice for preserving national solidarity.

The venue of the meeting was decorated with national flags, portraits of national heroes and placards inscribed with patriotic slogans. Some of the slogans read: "Pakistan Zindabad", "Al-Jihad, Al-Jihad", "Crush India" and "Down with Hindu imperialism."

About the same slogans were shouted by the spirited crowd throughout the meeting.

The Commander, Eastern Command thanked the people of Saidpur for their inspiring and spontaneous support and said that he was sure that the people, with such an indomitable will, cannot be defeated. Amidst shouts of "Pakistan Zindabad", Gen. Niazi declared "victory will, Insha Allah be ours."

Gen. Niazi said Divine help will also be on our side as we

are fighting for our survival. India, on the contrary is fighting to satisfy her expansionist designs, he added.

Gen. Niazi, quoting instances from history, emphasized the point that Muslims, though always outnumbered, never tasted a defeat in history. He said "we have tried Hindus many a time in the past and every time we defeated them. This time too, victory will Insha Allah, be ours."

He advised the people to be aware of traitors and Indian agents who were trying to undermine unity in our ranks. He pitied the Indian agents who are instrumental in the enemy hands.

After the meeting, Gen. Niazi saw a variety of material captured from the Indian soldiers in recent actions in the area. The material included mortars, rifles, grenades, ammunition, wireless sets, water bottles, uniforms of Indian soldiers and their personal documents.
