

# Last Message From Dacca

GAUHATI, India, March 26 —The Dacca station of Radio Pakistan has broadcast only military music interspersed with announcements of the martial law regulations since it was taken over by the Pakistan Army early today.

Until the Army takeover, the station "Dacca Betar Kendra" (Independent Dacca Radio) controlled by the autonomy-seeking East Pakistanis, was the main source of news from the strife-torn province.

The last message over "Dacca Betar Kendra," delivered in the cultured tones of announcer Nazma Akhtar, said:

"The 75 million people of Bangla Desh, freedom-loving as they are, have been subjected to brutal genocide by the army.

"The people of Bangla Desh will shed more blood rather than forget the injury. We will never allow the sacrifice to go in vain."

The announcer added that the people of Bangla Desh were "being dominated and exploited by the minority West Pakistanis in the name of Islam, which has brought to the world the message of justice and equality."

"Dacca Betar Kendra" is frequently monitored at this Assamese town near the East Pakistan border.
