President says traitors must be punished

March 26.—Shaikh Mujibur Rahman tonight proclaimed East Pakistan the Sovereign Independent People's Republic of Bangla Desh. according to a clandestine hadio report monitored near the East Pakistan border. The Press Trust of India (P.T.I) published the report which was monitored/at Agar tala, in the Indian territory o Tripura, about 56 miles east of Dacca. P.T.I. said that the broadcast-was not made by the Shaikh himself but by an und

identified announcer. The broadcast said that troops of the East Bengal Regiment the East Pakistan Rifles, and the "entire police force" had surrounded West Pakistan troops in Chittagong, Comilla. Sylhet. Jessore, Barisal and Khulna, and that heavy fighting was con-

A later message said that forces loyal to Shaikh Mujibur had captured the Chittagong station of Radio Pakistan forcing troops to retreat after fierce fighting.


It added that West Pakistan forces were hunting for Shaikh Mujihur, who was said to have gone underground after the fighting began.

[Reports from Calcutta said Shaikh Mujibur had crossed into Indian territory pursued by Pakistani troops. The Indian Defence Ministry denied that any Pakistani forces had crossed the frontier.]

The broadcast called upon the people of "free Bangla Desh? to continue their move-ment for independence until the last enemy soldier has vanished". It said that the Shaikh was "the only leader of the people of independent Bangla Desh" and his command should be obeyed to save the country from "the ruthless dictatorship of West Pakistanis

Opposition, Members India's Parliament urged Government to give the Hast Pakistani "freedom fighters support. Government spokesmen replied that the situation was being watched closely: there was to be a Cabinet meeting tomorrow, and the chief of the Indian Army staff, had cancelled his appointments and returned to Delhl.

President Yahya Khan said



in a nationwide radio broadcast tonight that the Shaikh's Awami Lague, which won an overwhelming majority of seats in East Pakistan in the elections for the National Assembly in December, would be completely banned.

He said that the Shaikh had flouted the authority of the Government and attacked the integrity of Pakistan. "This crime will not go unpunished."

He described the Shaikh's action in starting his noncooperation movement as "an act of treason. He and his party have defied the lawful authority for over three weeks. They have insulted Pakistan's flag defiled photographs of the father of the nation. They have tried to run a parallel Government. They have created turmoil, terror and insecurity".

Of his recent talks in Dacca with the Shaikh, he said: "His obstinacy, his obduracy and absolute refusal to talk sense lead to only one conclusion the man and his party are enemies of Pakistan. They want East Pakistan to break away completely from Pakistan.

He assured Pakistanis that his remained the same-namely, the transfer of power to the elected representatives of the people. As soon as the situation permits, I will take fresh steps towards the achievement of this objective.

Meanwhile, he said, all politheal activity throughout Pakistan would be banned, there would be a complete censorship of the press and a currew would be imposed on Dacca and all other cities of East Pakistan.

The martial law authorities said later, according to monitored reports, that anyone seen on the streets during the hours of curfew would be shot on sight. In

his broadcast tonight. President Yahya revealed that Shaikh Mujibur had proposed an interim period between the withdrawal of martial law and the solve the meeting of the National Assembly during which provincial governments would be set up and the National Assembly would first sit as two committees, one composed of East Pakistan members, the other of West Pakistan members.

The President said he was ready to agree in principle if he freceived the unequivocal agreement of all political leaders, as otherwise "a vacuum would be created and chaotic conditions would ensue

The Press Trust of India, quoting clandestine radio reports from East Pakistan, spoke of heavy casualties in the fighting between East and West Pakistan armed forces and severe fighting was said to be taking place in Dacca and several other parts

in Petrapole, an Indian town on. the East Pakistan frontier, reported that gunfire was clearly audible from Benapole just across the border.

The fighting is reported to have broken out at midday when West Pakistan troops moved in to seize men of the East Pakistan Rifles in their barracks at Dacca. According to some clandestine radio bulletins, the East Pakistan Rifles have about 18,000 men in their ranks, of whom two thirds
