NEW DELHI, Sun, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's supporters today formed a provisional government in East Pakistan and appealed to other countries to extend immediate recognition, a clandestine radio broadcast reported.

by Indian sources, said a Major Zia Khan had been appointed temporary head of the new government of Bangla Desh (Bengali nation) "under the leadership of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman."

Major Zia had been identified in clandestine radio reports last night as the head of the liberation army of the Sheikh's Awami League.

The radio did not give any explanation, why Major Zia had been appointed the de facto leader of the provisional government instead of Sheikh Mujibur.

In Washington Secretary of State William P. Rogers said real economic development of the south Asian subcontinent could occur only if India and Pakistan resolve the Kashmir problem.
