Liberation Army Starts March To Dacca

S.O.S. From Yahya's Men For Reinforcements

NEW DELHI, March 28.-As Free Bangla Radio announced the formation of a Provisional Government for Bangla Desh and the "liberation forces" of Mr Mujibur Rahman began marching to Dacca, the Pakistani Navy joined the Army and the Air Force in the effort to crush the resistance movement, report UNI and PTL

The sticky position of the Pak-istani Army in Dacca, despite the massive destruction wrought by the siss of artitlery, tanks and bomber aircraft, came to light when In-dian montors picked up an SOS to the West wing headquarters for help as it was "impossible to save Dacca."
