## Appeal To Nations For Recognition FREEDOM FIGHTERS MARCH ON DACCA

CALCUTTA, MAR 28-THE FREE BANGLA RADIO TODAY ANNOUNC ED A PROVISIONAL BANGLA DESH GOVERNMENT HEADED BY MAJOR JIA KHAN AND SAID ITS FORCES WERE ON THE MARCH FROM CHITTAGONG, REPORTS PTI.

FITHE RADIO SAID THE MARCH ON DACCA BEGAN AT 0845 HOURS TODAY.

The Government would be guided by Banga Bandhu Mujibur Rahman, at present directing the freedom struggle from his underground headquarters in Chittagong, the broadcast said.
